Anaesthetic Clinical Experience:

In Jordan

At the Jordan University Hospital, which is the major teaching and tertiary referral hospital in the country with a capacity of 500 beds? Anaesthesia was administered for 18000 patients a year. The hospital now has 18 operating theatres. Anaesthetic staff consisted of a Professor of Anaesthesia, three Associate Professors, six Assistant professors (Senior Consultants), six Specialist, one Assistant Specialist and 30 Residents in Anaesthesia.

The period of training leading to the Jordanian Board in Anaesthesia is four years Now, and it was 3 yrs on my time. There is a daily Morning Report to discuss patients managed during the previous night, and potential problematic cases on the day's lists, a lecture in Basic Sciences or Clinical Anaesthesia.

The actual clinical work consists of accompanied lists in the first year in General Surgery, Urology, Gynaecology, Orthopaedics' and Emergency Surgery, as I became more experienced; I had more active involvement in day-to-day Anaesthetic management. In the second year, we received training in Intensive Care Medicine, and Surgical sub specialities including Obstetrics, Ophthalmology, ENT, Neonatal and Paediatric, Neurosurgery, Vascular, Cardiothoracic and Transplant Surgery. The third and fourth years of training are more independent Anaesthetic management, still under consultant cover, and preparation for teaching sessions, and assisting in tutorial sessions for undergraduate medical students.

Residents On calls are every second to every third night as a member of a team consisting of a Senior Resident, ICU Resident, two second /third year residents, and two/three first year Residents. Consultants and Specialists are available from home when needed for high risk patients.

There was continuous day-to-day assessment, a yearly theoretical and clinical examination and a final year examination. And after three years (now four years), I was eligible to sit for my Jordanian Board Examination, which I passed from the first attempt (1987).

After obtaining my Jordanian Board of Anaesthesia, I worked for two years as specialist /Fellow in

Anaesthesia. At Jordan university Hospital I had more clinical involvement in Paediatric and neonatal Surgery, Intensive Care Medicine. I had more administrative duties in arranging different schedules cover for daily programs. I had more involvement in teaching and supervision of training of undergraduate students and postgraduate medical Residents and running the intensive care unit for two years.

Then I was *appointed as a lecturer* in Anaesthesia and intensive care at *Jordan university hospital* from *1990 till 1998* where I was involved in all different rotational anaesthesia specialities including general, thoracic, transplant (kidney), orthopaedics, ENT ,Dental, ophthalmology, Neonatal paediatric, Urology, Neurosurgery, Plastic, Obstetrics and Gynaecology and Emergency Anaesthesia

I was involved in teaching fourth year medical students and residents in all levels and covering the consultants in calls and participating in lectures for teaching in different educational levels.

1998 The University of Jordan offered me a scholarship in Germany to get higher degree (Facharzt) in anaesthesiology. And then upon coming back to be appointed as Assistant professor.

In Federal Republic of Germany:

I have been working at University *Hospital of Giessen* since October 1998 as Assistant Arzt in Anaesthesia. This post is fully recognized for training purposes. The hospital provides a comprehensive training program in Anaesthesia, which includes a twice weekly tutorial session in the theoretical basis and clinical applications of Anaesthesia, accompanied clinical sessions in various surgical specialties and Intensive Care Medicine. I have been gaining extensive experience in conduction of General and Regional Anaesthesia for General,

Cardiac ,Vascular Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Urology, Orthopedics and Trauma, Maxillofacial Surgery, major Head and Neck Surgery and ENT, Neurosurgery, Day Case Surgery and Ophthalmology Anaesthesia., I have gained more experience working on the General intensive care and pain clinic before getting my Facharzt. Degree.

Which is a university referral tertiary hospital of around 1200 beds the university is around 400 years old!!!! The department of Anaesthesia is a large one with around 90-100 (Including Consultants and residents staff members) (see Plse Previous mentioned web site), with A range of 25000-30000 operation per year providing services for Giessen which is university center, and the Area Around in State Of Hessen/ Germany, now the University and University Hospital became Combined with Marburg university and Marburg university Hospital.

I have had the opportunity to be involved in anaesthetizing patients for major ENT, Maxilofacial, Orthopedics and spinal surgery. Ophthalmology , Neurosurgery, General Surgery and renal transplant. Cardiac Anesthesia for Adults and Pediatric Cardiac Anaesthesia , adult and Pediatric Cardiac transplantation, Thoracic Anaesthesia

Intensive care training, for acute post operative pain management and Chronic Pain management.

After I got my Facharzt I did my <u>Fellowship As a Facharzt</u> in Chronic Pain Management and a Consultant In the intensive Care Unit Since September 2000- end August 2001 in both: Chronic Pain Management and Intensive Care unit at the Giessen University Hospital Germany

IN PAIN THERAPY UNIT where we did use to have a pain unit of 12 beds in addition to outpatient Pain clinic.

We did use to do management round in 12 beds inpatient clinic floor, which they use to come in the morning for diagnosis and management in a day case bases or for admission—when needed, we Admit patient for diagnosis and Pain management, according to the patients diagnosis and we use to have a schedule—plan—for managing patient problem—by different pain medication and procedures including different neuronal therapy procedures and acupuncture etc., where some of them—will be discharge at the end of the day and others will remain for some few days—as inpatient according to the need for invasive procedures—or needed therapy or diagnostic techniques.

These patients will remain as inpatient for investigation or invasive procedures for continuous IV pain therapy accordingly.

our team was formed from 2 consultants and 2 specialist and 2 residents .we start our work at 7 am and ending by closing round at 12 midday .

During that I got the necessary theoretical and practical courses of pain therapy and acupuncture from Giessen university 1st and 2nd trimester 2001. While doing also pain therapy management in daily bases.

In addition to that we did use to see the other in **outpatient bases** that they did use to come for pain management medication, follow up and continuing there pain management and therapy and necessary procedures and Acupuncture etc.. That is scheduled for these patients on that day in the same floor. FOR DETAILS VISIT PLEASE:

Daily In the after noon I did use to have my duty from midday till evening (B) shift in The Intensive care unit where I rotated in the Giessen University Hospital Intensive Care Unit)

And I was working as A CONSULTANT in INTENSIVE CARE UNIT .which has 12 beds, the largest in Giessen, which undertakes haemofiltration, haemodialysis and plasma exchange in support of patients with multiple organ failure.

I was involved in admission, Therapy, which include medications, invasive monitoring including, central line, arterial line, Pulmonary artery catheter insertion, invasive and non invasive ventilation, weaning, fluid and blood transfusion therapy, Hemofiltration and percutaneous tracheotomy, chest tube insertion and ultra sound guided for diagnosis and procedures like percutaneous cystestomy., diagnostic and therapeutic Bronchoscopy and TEE. Liver failure replacement therapy And temporary pacemaker. Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation And other needed Procedures.

Our patients were admitted from inside and outside of the hospital including different medical Diseases post surgical patients, traumatology, other critically ill patients after surgery.

Our team was at each shift 2 Consultants and One fellows with Facharzt degree or Facharzt eligible. For detail see please: (Klink-Operative Intensivstation). Web site

In my present job I am working as a consultant anesthesiologist and one member of the teaching staff in the faculty of Medicine at the Jordan University, teaching 4th yearer medical students and teaching and training postgraduate anesthetists to be able to get their master degree and Jordanian Board in Anaesthesia and Intensive Care. The actual clinical work consists of supervising the registrars' and anaesthetizing patients in different aspect of general surgery and for subspecialties as Neurosurgery, Urology, Orthopedics, and Pediatrics, Cardiac and Cardiovascular surgery, Ophthalmology. Maxillofacial, plastic, gynecology and obstetrics.

In Addition to see and manage patients with Chronic pain symptoms in the clinic or As a consultations and I am interested in Patient with (CRPS). And Acupuncture.

and since 2001 mostly I do anesthesia for Neurosurgical patients for different Ages from Newborns and Old patients in a busy teaching Neurosurgical unit within our Hospital. and other specialities in rotational bases or during leave of our colleagues in vacation.

In Feb. 2006 I had started as **Consultant** cover for the **intensive care unite** with other two consultants of my colleagues. Being a consultant in the department I am working as a team leader

during on calls and I am involved in doing anesthesia for different patients and different specialties and also in managing different administrative works.

Since *September 2006* I was appointed as *Deputy Chairman* of the department of anesthesia at Jordan university Hospital and Faculty of medicine.
