## **Professional experiences:**

### **Obstetrics:**

Since joining the specialty program in June 1995, I have been involved in the antenatal, intrapartum and post partum care of patients with gradually increasing experience and responsibility.

This has included comprehensive experience in the management of normal and abnormal pregnancies, labours and deliveries; I have been trained in different aspects of labour ward management including techniques of fetal monitoring, labour, instrumental deliveries and caesarean sections of different indications. I have gained experience in the standard ultrasound techniques and in performing amniocentesis.

## **Gynaecology:**

- Currently a urogynaecologist at the University of Jordan, I cover 3 clinics a week, a session of urodynamics and 2 full days theatres, in addition to teaching medical students and registrars.
- During my fellowship training in Australia, I have assisted and performed multiple Urogynaecologic and reconstructive pelvic surgeries, covering outpatients clinics, urodynamics and involved in research.
- I have also acquired good experience in diagnostic and operative laparoscopic techniques
- I have performed almost all the minor and most of the major gynaecological operations including tubal surgery, ovarian surgery, myomectomy, hysterectomy and vaginal surgery, and dealt with almost all gynaecological emergencies.
- I was involved in the surgical management of gynaecological malignancies including radical hysterectomies and debulking surgeries and in the management of many cases of gestation trophoblastic disease.
