Staff specialists/VMOs supervised all inpatient activites.
- Specialized expertise in sleep medicine and respiratory failure with the use of non-invasive ventilation, both acutely and chronically. A weekly respiratory failure clinic with specialized expertise in neuromuscular disease and an active link with neurology, palliative care, and gastroenterology service. - A busy consultation service within the hospital and is mainly involved in the care of patients in the intensive care unit and both hematology bone marrow transplant and the renal transplant units.
